



1 **WHEREAS**, Section 902 of the Howard County Charter authorizes the creation of
2 temporary advisory boards of residents to assist in the consideration of administrative policies
3 and programs; and

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5 **WHEREAS**, the Howard County Council recognizes that residents of the County have an
6 interest in an open and transparent land use planning process which affords them meaningful
7 opportunities to give input on development issues which affect them; and

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9 **WHEREAS**, the County Council recognizes that there is opportunity for improvement in
10 public engagement in the land use planning process; and

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12 **WHEREAS**, the County Council sees a need for a task force to study the land use
13 planning process and recommend ways to make it more inclusive; and

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15 **WHEREAS**, the County Council believes that such a task force should comprise diverse
16 and interested parties, including residents, business owners, and government officials to reflect
17 the diversity of the County and the multitude of concerns and solutions to be investigated.

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19 **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the County Council of Howard County,
20 Maryland, this 3rd day of Dec, 2007, that the County Council establishes the Public
21 Engagement in Land Use Planning Task Force to perform the following tasks:

1. EXAMINE CURRENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT IN THE LAND PLANNING PROCESS, IDENTIFY OPPORTUNITIES FOR CLARIFYING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION, AND RECOMMEND POTENTIAL LEGISLATIVE ACTIONS AND ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES.
2. Elect co – chairs from the task force’s membership to direct and facilitate the group’s functions. There shall be one co-chair who represents residential interests and the other co-chair shall represent development interests; and
3. Prepare and present to the County Council a draft task force report by May 5, 2008 which recommends potential changes to the County’s planning process. LEGISLATIVE ACTIONS AND ADMINISTRATIVE CHANGES.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard County, that the Public Engagement in Land Use Planning Task Force consists of the following members appointed by the Council:

1. 3 resident members named by each Council member;
2. A member to be named by the League of Women Voters of Howard County;
3. A member to be named by the Howard County Citizens Association;
4. A member to be named by the ~~Columbia Association~~ HOWARD COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY;
5. A member to be named by the Howard County Chapter of the Home Builders Association of Maryland;
6. A member to be named by Howard County Association of Realtors;
7. A member to be named by the Howard County Chamber of Commerce;
8. A MEMBER TO BE NAMED BY THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF INDUSTRIAL AND OFFICE PARKS; AND
9. Two members with expertise in Howard County zoning law to be named by the Howard County Bar Association, one member shall represent residential interests and the other shall represent development interests.

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AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the County Council of Howard County that the task force membership may break into sub-committees to accomplish its tasks and the membership of any sub-committee may expand as needed to accomplish the task.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council of Howard County asks the County Executive to assign one staff member to attend task force meetings and provide expertise and advice from the Department of Planning and Zoning and the Department of Public Works.
